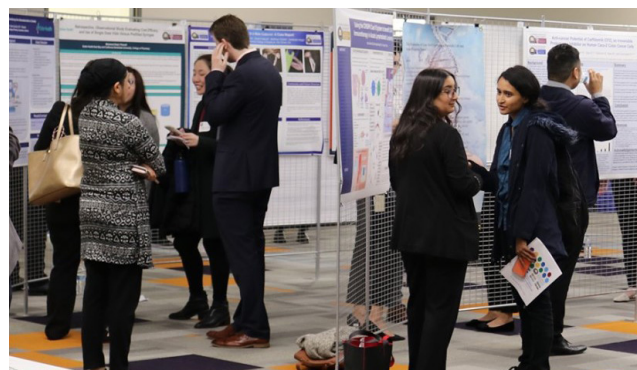


Pharmacy Internship & Networking Fair

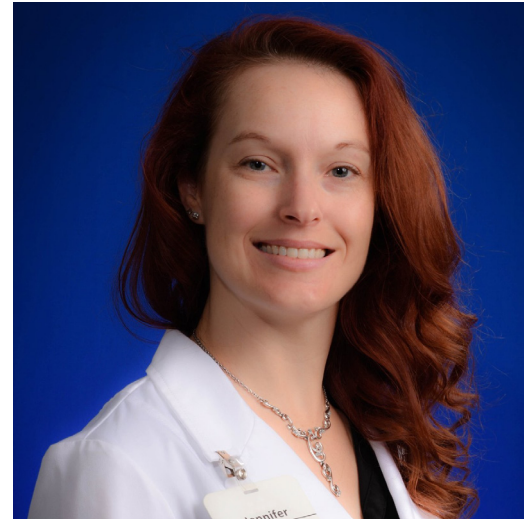
CPHA's New Practitioner of the Year

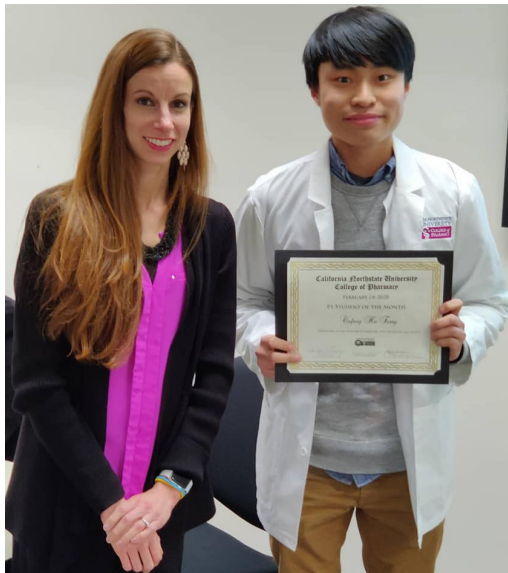

At the SNPhA National Conference, this team will present their accomplishments and have the chance to win a \$10,000 grant to continue their service to the community.
