Faculty Spotlight

Dr. Kevin Dong, Assistant Professor



"...It is time for me to give back to students and share my experience..."

Tell me a bit about your background and how it led you to pursue a PharmD?

My favorite and best subjects back in college were math and physics, so I thought about pursuing an engineering career. However, with my mentor's guidance, I started to learn more about pharmacy and realized it is another amazing career.

While in pharmacy school, I was interested in pharmacy and pharmaceutical law and regulation. I established an APPE rotation with the FDA during my P4 year, and I was the first batch of pharmacy students at CNU to undertake this opportunity. It was a great experience to network with all the FDA pharmacists. I realized there are many non-traditional pharmacy career options available in these regulatory agencies. Pharmacists, for example, can work as domestic and international FDA drug inspectors, as well as consumer safety officers. From my FDA experience, I also learned that pharmacists could even wear uniforms to work as U.S. Public Health Service (PHS) Officers. USPHS Officer Pharmacists could work in many different aspects of federal agencies, such as the Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), U.S Coast Guard Pharmacy, Federal Bureau of Prisons and Indian Health Services. There are a multitude of pharmacy career options in these agencies that can make your career life interesting and challenging. To this day, I still maintain connections with some of my mentors from the FDA and the USPHS. Their work ethic and officer mentality has really inspired me.

After graduation, I have worked in retail and long-term care pharmacy settings. Due to my rotation experience in the federal agencies, I started to explore career options in California state agencies. I have been working for the state for over 7 years in 3 different departments: the State Board of Pharmacy, State Prisons, and Department of Health Care Services.

What motivated you to pursue academia?

I think it is time for me to give back to students and share my experience, including my success and my past failures. In that way, students could learn from my experiences and have greater accomplishments and success than me in their pharmacy careers.

What is the most rewarding aspect of being a pharmacist or a professor?

The most rewarding aspect of being a pharmacist is expanding and creating more career options for the pharmacy profession. It is a rewarding moment when I see my mentee or students obtaining successful careers, and having a and make a larger impact on the pharmacy profession and public health.

"...I get to be my own boss."

Can you explain a little bit about the career path you chose? How did CNU help to shape this career path for you?

I chose medical writing because I felt stuck in my retail job. I also write novels full-time, because I love creating stories and connecting with the audience. CNU gave me the appropriate writing and research background I needed to build a foundation for a medical writing career. My specialty APPE rotation in online medical information and social media was a good (but small) introduction to medical writing.

What would you say is the most rewarding aspect of your career?

The fact that I get to be my own boss. I don't have to clock in, clock out. I work at my own time, at my own pace. I can take breaks when I want. I can turn down clients I don't want to work with. I get to choose how I work and live. That's freedom you can't get working for a corporation.

Do you have any advice for students on how to choose which career path would be best for them?

Your career should ideally align with your strengths, values, and interests. It should also match the lifestyle you want to live. I value freedom and autonomy, so writing was perfect for me. Be willing to take risks if you want to build something for yourself and feel more fulfilled. But most importantly, listen to your heart.

Who was your role model growing up? Did they influence you in any way to choose pharmacy?

I chose pharmacy because I thought it'd be the "right" choice - a way to earn a stable income, as well as a way to practice patient care. Turns out, life is more complicated than that. My role model growing up was Amy Lee. She's the lead singer of the band Evanescence. As one of the rare but celebrated women in the rock industry, she's had to break down a lot of barriers in a male-dominated industry that's often sexist and misogynistic. She's also fought a lot of battles to write songs and compose music the way she wanted to without the producers changing her art. To this day, I still listen to her music and I'm inspired every day. In a weird way, her music kept me sane through all the tough years in undergrad and pharmacy school. She also gave me the inspiration I needed to write my own debut novel, The Catalyst.


THE RESERVE THE RE
