

## **SCHOOL PERFORMANCE FACT SHEET (2017 / 2018)**

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### **What is CNUCOP's graduation rate?**

**2017:** Out of the 114 students who matriculated in 2013, 99 students (86.84%) graduated in four years and 106 students (92.98%) graduated within 150% of the published program length.

**2018:** Out of the 120 students who matriculated in 2014, with the addition of a transfer student, 121 students were eligible for graduation in 2018. Out of the 121 students available for graduation, 115 students (95.04%) graduated in four years and 117 students (97.50%) graduated within 150% of the published program length.

#### **How did CNUCOP compile the graduation information?**

The Office of Academic Affairs, in conjunction with the Office of the Registrar, compiled this information based on accurate raw data that is used to track CNUCOP's students' success.

#### **How did CNUCOP compile the Job Placement Rates?**

The Office of Student Affairs and Admission (OSAA) administers a post-graduation employment survey to all graduating students about one month prior to graduation, where the student is asked to self-identify their employment and salary information. In 2017 and 2018, the OSAA also contacted students directly if they did not respond to the survey. Unfortunately, OSAA was not able to obtain a 100% response rate, and this information only represents the graduates from whom we were able to obtain data.

#### **What was the raw data generated from the Post-Graduation Employment Survey?**

**2017:** Of the 106 students who graduated in 2017, we received 73 responses to the survey. Of those 73 students who responded, 6 were actively seeking employment and 67 had secured employment in the field. Unfortunately, 33 students chose not to answer and were not reached upon attempted follow-ups.

**2018:** Of the 117 students who graduated in 2018, we received 93 responses to the survey. Of those 93 students, 1 was actively seeking employment and 92 graduates had secured employment in the field. Unfortunately, 24 students chose not to answer and were not reached upon attempted follow ups.

#### **How did CNUCOP compile the License Examination Passage Rates?**

## Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.



- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

### **STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL**

Students' Right to cancel provision from the Student Enrollment Agreement in effect for the class which entered the institution in the Fall Semester of 2018 is excerpted below:

#### **"STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL AND REFUND:**

You have the right to cancel this Course Enrollment Agreement until 12:01 AM on the first calendar day after the first classroom instruction session you attend (12:01 AM on August 21, 2018), or until 12:01 AM on the eighth calendar day after you sign this Enrollment Agreement, whichever is later.

Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation to the Admissions Office at the University's address shown at the top of the first page of this Enrollment Agreement. You can do this by hand delivery, email, facsimile, or mail. Written notice of cancellation sent by hand delivery, email, or facsimile is effective upon receipt by the Admissions Office. Written notice of cancellation sent by mail is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with postage prepaid.

If you cancel this Enrollment Agreement, the University will refund the amount of tuition that you paid within forty-five (45) days after your notice of cancellation is received by the Admissions Office. The \$100.00 Enrollment Fee and the Student Tuition Recovery Fund Fee (if assessed) will not be refunded. For students who participate in the student health plan, a premium in the estimated amount of \$3,200.00 per year is set by the health plan, which is an outside provider, and will not be refunded unless the health plan provides a refund and, if so, then only according to the plan's terms."
