#### 2. What advice would you like to share with our pharmacy students about choosing their career path?

Gain diverse experiences early on. Pursue introductory and advanced pharmacy practice experiences (IPPEs and APPEs) in



various settings - hospital, ambulatory care, community pharmacy, managed care, industry, etc. This will help you determine what aspects of pharmacy most resonate with you. Engage in research, teaching assistant roles, and leadership opportunities as a student to explore academic interests. Cultivate strong mentoring relationships. Identify professors, preceptors, and pharmacists who are doing work you admire. Ask if you can shadow them, collaborate on a project, or just discuss their career trajectory. Mentors can offer invaluable guidance as you discern your professional goals and help open doors to opportunities.

Consider post-graduate training. Completing a PGY1 pharmacy residency after graduation is becoming increasingly important for many pharmacist positions, especially in clinical settings. A PGY2 allows you to specialize even further. A fellowship may be a good option if you are passionate about research or education. While additional training is a significant investment, it can significantly expand your skill set and career options.

Look for ways to combine your interests. A rewarding pharmacy career often involves wearing multiple hats. Clinical pharmacists also precept students, conduct research, and serve on committees. Academia allows you to blend teaching, scholarship, and practice. Don't feel limited to just one professional track – seek creative ways to integrate your talents and passions. Stay open to new possibilities. The pharmacy profession constantly evolves with new roles, practice models, and emerging technologies. Your interests may also shift over time based on your experiences. Embrace a mindset of lifelong learning, adaptability, and growth. Your career path may take unexpected turns, leading to fulfilling destinations.






