





## California Northstate University College of Pharmacy (CNUCOP) Admission Scholarships

Academic Year 2025-2026: Three-Year PharmD Program

Students entering the first professional year (P1) of the pharmacy program, or transfer students, starting in the Fall of 2025 may be eligible for the scholarships described below.

The CNUCOP *General Admission Scholarships* are awarded based on availability and an applicant's evidence of academic accomplishment, as listed in the criteria below.

Scholarship Criteria:

- Eligibility is based primarily on cumulative GPA of the applicant at the time of acceptance:
  - Entering P1s: Cumulative GPA calculated by PharmCAS at the time of acceptance.
  - Transfer Students:
    - Domestic transfer students: Cumulative GPA in the previous PharmD program.
    - International transfer students: GPA based on WES/ECE evaluation of cumulative GPA from international PharmBS/ PharmD program, and may include other courses taken.

Scholarship Renewal Criteria:\*

• Scholarships may be renewed annually based on cumulative CNUCOP GPA, calculated after the summer trimester (trimester III). Criteria to maintain the scholarship are described in the scholarship notification letter provided to the accepted student and outlined below.

Cumulative GPA at Time of Acceptance	Annual Scholarship	CNUCOP PharmD GPA threshold to maintain scholarship
≥ 3.75	\$15,000	≥ 3.75
≥3.5-3.75	\$12,000	≥ 3.5
≥3.25- 3.5	\$10,000	≥ 3.25
≥3.0-3.25	\$8,000	≥ 3.0
≥2.75-3.0	\$5,000	≥ 2.75
≥2.5-2.75	\$2,500	≥ 2.5

\*If a student's cumulative GPA falls below the threshold required to maintain the original scholarship amount, then the scholarship may be reduced to the amount associated with the student's new cumulative GPA. However, if the cumulative GPA rises to the threshold required to maintain the original scholarship at the end of the next academic year (trimester 5), the student be eligible to have their original scholarship amount reinstated.
