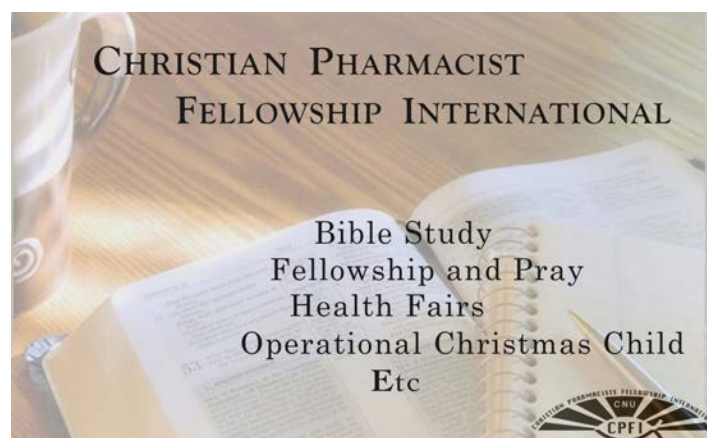

The Rho Chi Insignia

The **Greek letters**, "Rho" and "Chi," were originally selected because, when placed in the relative position in which they are found on the Rho Chi Key, they are emblematic of the prescription sign.

The **colors** attached to the seal of membership were chosen to indicate the royalty of purple and the loyalty of white.

The **octagonal key** has sides that now represent chemistry, biology, physiology, pharmaceuticals, pharmacology, and the biomedical, social/administrative, and clinical sciences. This key represents the use of medication in health care.

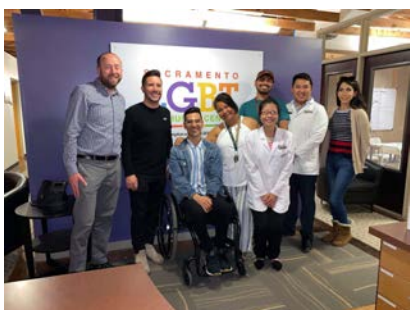

Mission Statement

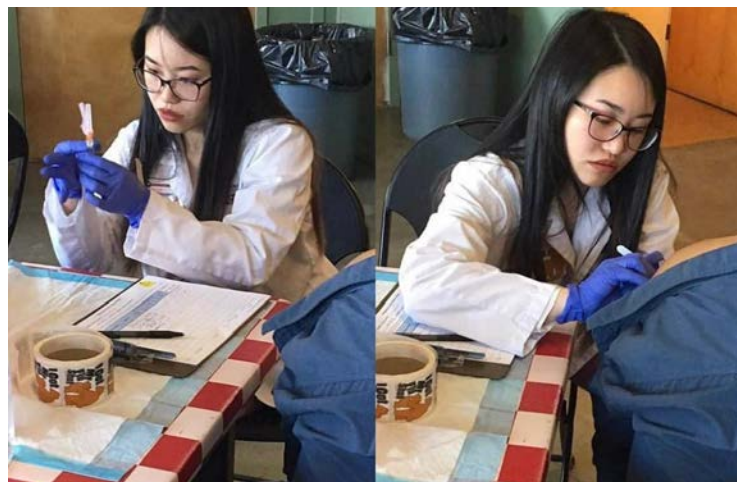

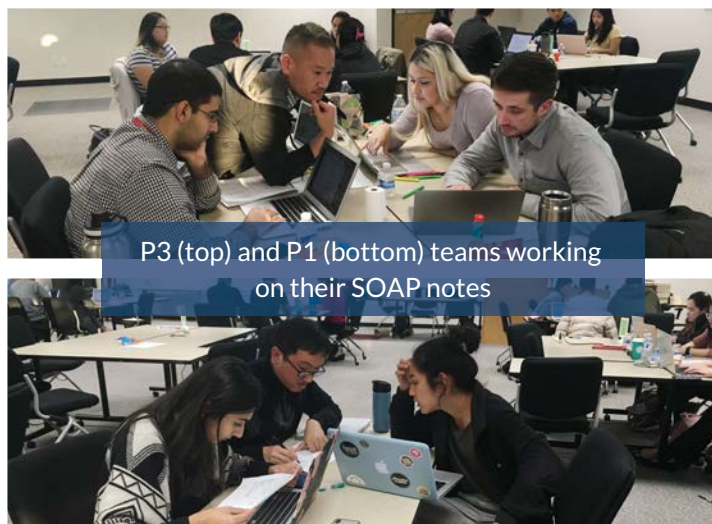
Residency Roundtable

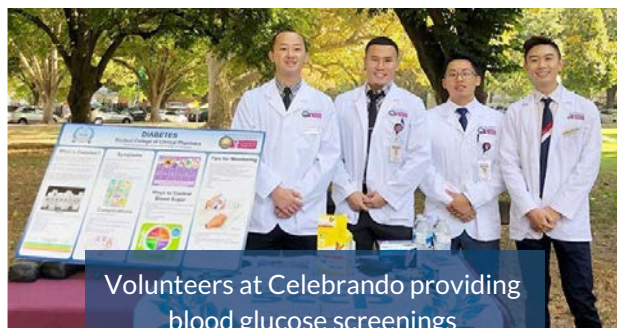

Shadowing at Beale Air Force Base

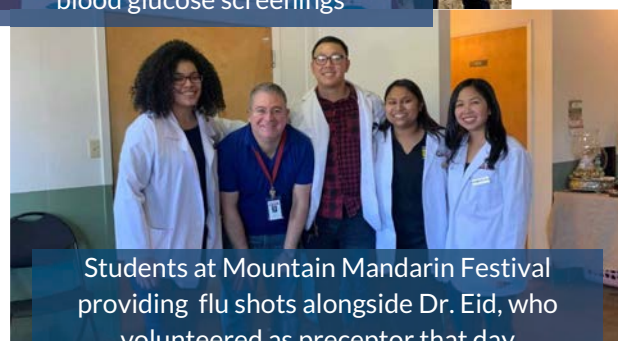

CSHP Mentorship Program



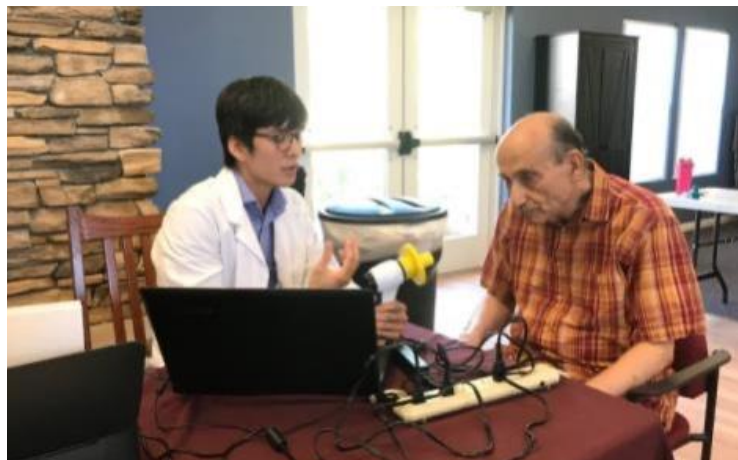
Students from CNU and UOP are matched with health-system pharmacists from Sacramento-Valley CSHP for guidance in CV review, interview practice, and professional development.
